CAMP INFORMATION

Cue Camp Friendship provides campers with a supportive environment to learn and/or improve cueing skills. Families and professionals from all around the country will come together to learn and to develop friendships that will last a lifetime. Clear communication is the foundation of Cue Camp Friendship. Our goal is to accommodate all the communication needs of campers.

Cue Camp Friendship 2011 will be held at the Claggett Conference Center, which overlooks the beautiful Sugarloaf Mountain in Buckeystown, MD. The camp is easily accessible from three major airports in the area. Travel time to the camp is approximately 1 hour from both Baltimore, MD and Washington, DC.

Directions to Cue Camp Friendship

From Washington, DC: Travel I-270 N to Frederick, MD and take Exit 26 to Rt. 80W (a right turn at bottom of the ramp) toward Buckeystown. Follow Rt. 80 for approximately 4 miles and the road will dead end at Rt. 85. Turn left onto Rt. 85 for approximately 200 yards and look for the Claggett Center sign on your left.

From all points west: Travel I-70 E to I-270 S (toward Washington, DC). About one mile past the split, take Exit 31B, Rt. 85 South toward Buckeystown, MD. Drive approximately 5 miles south on Rt. 85, a short distance past Buckeystown, MD. The Claggett Center sign will be on your left.

BASIC CAMP SCHEDULE

INSTRUCTIONAL CLASSES

Hearing and deaf children four (4) years and younger will be under supervised care during class time and will be exposed to Cued Speech via games, stories and conversation.

Hearing and deaf children five (5) years and older will be taught Cued Speech at their appropriate level. Instruction will be in Cued Speech with signing used as a back-up for those children whose only mode of communication is sign language.

Non-cueing adults will be placed in a beginner-level class.

Adults who know how to cue (at any level) will be placed in Beyond the Basics.

A variety of informational presentations will be offered in the evening after class (5:00-6:00 pm.) Childcare provided.

ACCOMMODATIONS AND MEALS

Overnight campers will stay in dormitory-style lodgings and will need to provide their own linens.

Overnight campers will be served meals from Fri. breakfast to Sun. breakfast. Day campers receive LUNCH ONLY unless arrangements are made in advance. Vegetarian meals are available upon request.
